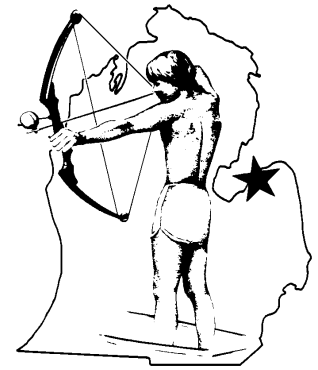

Bowfishermen Wallow in Carp

Contestants Remove 47 Tons of Rough Fish from Saginaw Bay

CASEVILLE, MI – A maximum limit of 250 two-man teams from across the country participated in the 17th annual Great Lakes Bowfishing Championship (GLBC) held in Caseville, MI. This popular two-day tournament in which archers ply their trade in an effort to arrow rough fish, took place June 3 & 4 on the waters of Saginaw Bay.

The eager bowfishermen were treated to nice weather all weekend long, which usually translates into large numbers of fish.

The teams were turned loose from Beadle Bay Marina at 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning. Their mission was to harvest and weigh-in as many rough fish as possible by the 5:00 p.m. deadline. Then they would do it all again on Sunday, canvassing the shallows from Caseville to Bay City. This area of the state offers some of the best bowfishing action found anywhere in the country.

The top teams would be determined by the greatest combined weight of carp, as well as other rough fish, such as gold carp, goldfish, gar pike, and dogfish.

By 5:00 p.m. a line of vehicles and trailers prepared to check in their fish at the marina. The seasoned GLBC staff kept the competitors and their catch moving through the 14 weigh stations at a brisk pace. The scene was rather frenzied with hoards of spectators gathering at the marina, likely attracted to the unusual sight by the WLEW Country Cruiser that was broadcasting from the tournament site.

By the time the dust had settled, the hard working bowfishermen had managed to rid the local waters of 43,808 pounds of “trash fish”. Over 21 tons – not a bad days work!

Michigan’s DNR wildlife biologists claim that these non-native invaders (carp) to Michigan’s waters ruin and deplete critical spawning and nesting habitat for other game fish and waterfowl. Thinning out the carp’s prolific numbers provides a tremendous boost to many of the area’s native species.

The largest carp of the day, sporting a \$10-per-pound prize sponsored by the local Caseville & Bayport area businesses, was taken by Brad Heath of Delphi, Indiana. Heath reeled in a 31.06-pound hawg, just edging out Jeff Baker of Marengo, Ohio, who arrowed a 30.16-pounder to take the \$5-per-pound second-place daily prize.

Following Saturday’s weigh-in, most teams retired to more relaxing activities for the evening. Many attended the GLBC Pig Roast to take delight in some fine barbecue, exciting raffles and enjoyable camaraderie. Others enjoyed the offerings of the local communities while recharging their batteries for round two of the great carp shoot.

Sunday morning found the 500 contestants back at it. By mid-morning, the sun had come through and triggered the carp's annual spring spawning ritual. Many bowfishermen found the action to be even better than the first day. But, finding water was another thing.

With the Saginaw Bay water level down between three and four feet from two years ago, most contestants had a long, muddy, tiring walk to reach the spawning fish. They had an even more difficult task returning their several hundred pound creels back to shore. This caused a few more teams than usual to return to the weigh-in late, after the deadline, thus disqualifying their daily take.

Following the 3:00 p.m. weigh-in, reams of weigh slips were tabulated. The weary bowfishermen indeed did have a banner day. They surpassed Saturday's haul by recording another 50,813 pounds, bringing the tournament total to an amazing 94,621 pounds of rough fish!

The 47-ton harvest was nearly double what any other event had ever recorded in the history of organized bowfishing tournaments. Even so, the catch didn't come close to the mind-boggling 287,871 pounds harvested at the 1996 GLBC tourney – the current standing world record.

Claiming the title of 2000 Great Lakes Bowfishing Champions were the team of Brant Gnagey and Thad McGathy of Bayport, MI. The pair managed to arrow and retrieve 2,842 pounds of fish. That's a lot of work for one weekend!

Taking a close second place with a respectable 2,750 pounds were the team of Rich and Dwayne Dufty of Caseville, MI. Third place honors went to John Goble of Columbia, MI and Matt Clemens of Silverwood, MI with 2,615 pounds. Cash prizes were awarded to the top 20 teams.

"This seemed to be the year of the airboat." commented Bob Easterbrook, Jr., Assistant Director of the GLBC, "Most of the top teams this year used airboats. That's usually not a distinct advantage, but with the water level down as low as it is this year, many great shooting areas out amongst the islands were only accessible by 'semi-amphibious' airboats."

Top "Big Fish" honors for Sunday went to Clemens with a 29.83-pound carp, closely followed by Danny Bertalan of Elk Rapids, MI with a 29.59-pound brute.

Prizes were also awarded for other rough fish species during the tournament. Mike Stumph of Westerville, OH nabbed the Largest Gold Carp cash prize by arrowing a 6.97-pounder. Bertalan struck gold again by taking a 2.56-pound Goldfish. Tom Schaffer of Pinckney, MI claimed the Largest

Gar Pike prize, tipping the scales with a nice 7.59-pounder. Mark Hendershot of Sandusky, MI took Largest Dogfish honors with a 7.31-pound lunger. And last, but not least, Jason Schulz of Ubyly, MI was honored for arrowing the smallest carp of the tournament, which weighed in at a mere 1.47 pounds.

A pair of compound bows donated by George Gardner of Hunters Mfg. Co. were awarded to the "Average Joe" team – the duo that harvested closest to the average weight per team. The team of Steve Kendrick of Bayview, ID and Jim Vivian of Louisville, KY brought in 378 pounds, landing them closest to the tournament's average mark of 378.48 pounds per team.

Besides providing a lot of recreational fun for hundreds of sportsmen and ridding the bay of unwanted and destructive "trash fish", this tournament had another worthwhile underlying cause. Organizers raised thousands of dollars for the Wildlife Education Foundation Youth Camp located near Caseville.

The facility, a State-owned Outdoor Center nestled in the scenic woods of Sleeper State Park, was slated to be shut down and demolished in the early 1980's due to a lack of funding. The foundation stepped in and volunteered to fund, operate, and improve the camp at that time. Now in its 17th year, the organization has hosted more than 60,000 campers. The vast majority of campers are kids who come from all over Michigan to experience the great outdoors, learn about environmental respect and wildlife conservation, and experience shooting sports and firearms safety. Thanks to the success of this tournament and the generosity of its supporters, money is never a barrier to kids who want an outdoor experience.

"I would like to thank the dozens of generous sporting goods manufacturers and dealers from around the country who donated merchandise," said tournament Director Bob Easterbrook, Sr. "Between them, the Caseville and Bayport area businesses, the supportive tournament participants, and especially our sponsors, **Bohning, Bowhunter Magazine, Muzzy Products,** and the **North American Archery Group,** the foundation and the kids who benefit from the camp are extremely grateful."

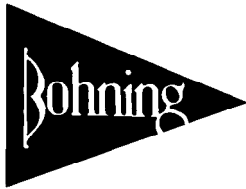
