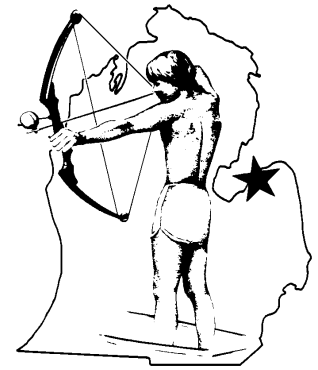

Weather Dampens Bowfishing Action

Contestants Harvest 13-1/2 Tons of Rough Fish from Saginaw Bay

CASEVILLE, MI – 250 two-man teams converged on Caseville, Michigan the weekend of June 2nd and 3rd for the eighteenth consecutive year to participate in the Great Lakes Bowfishing Championship (GLBC). They came from all across the country to partake of some of the best bowfishing action anywhere, attempting to harvest rough fish such as carp, gar pike and dogfish with bow and arrow. The timing of the tournament coincides with the fish's annual spawning ritual, which brings them into the vast shallows of the Saginaw Bay shoreline. All that is required is standard archery equipment, a bowfishing arrow with line, a boat or waders, and above all, some warm, sunny weather.

Everything fell into place this year, except for the weather. The unseasonably cool temperatures and on again, off again rain showers over the weekend sent the previously frolicking fish to the bottom to wait for more favorable conditions, and leaving many bowfishermen gazing into the waters hoping for a glimpse of their now shy quarry.

All 500 participants gathered at Beadle Bay Marina for the Saturday morning send off. At 8:00 a.m. they were turned loose to harvest as many of these non-indigenous "trash" fish as possible in the waters bordered by Caseville to the northeast, and Bay City to the southwest, by the 5 o'clock deadline. After two days, the top teams would be determined by the greatest overall weights.

The bowfishermen worked the marshes and canals along the shoreline all day. As the teams returned to the Marina's weigh-in site, it was evident the dismal weather had put a damper on the bowfishing action. Most teams had trouble locating fish and one to three fish, if any, seemed to be the only rewards for a hard day's work. However, with the changing winds late Friday night, some teams were able to stumble upon pockets of land-locked fish that managed to get themselves into a tight situation.

The first day's total weight came to 13,311 pounds of rough fish -- a good mess by most standards, but not what the gathering spectators had come to see. They've heard the

stories. And some have seen it before. They wanted to see pick up trucks, boats, and trailers overloaded with enormous amounts of carp. Front-end loaders filling dump trucks to the hilt. Maybe even a new world record, topping the 1996 mark of 278,871 pounds. After all, Michigan's DNR wildlife biologists claim that these non-native invaders to Michigan's waters ruin and deplete critical spawning and nesting habitat for other game fish and waterfowl. Thinning out the carp's prolific numbers provides a tremendous boost to many of the area's native game species.

Competition for the daily largest carp awards sponsored by the local Caseville & Bayport area businesses was very tight. Tony Stiller of Hamilton, Ontario, took the largest carp of the day, sporting a \$10-per-pound prize. Stiller reeled in a 21.09-pound "hawg", just edging out Dale Gentry of Richmond, IN, who arrowed a 20.75-pounder to take the \$5-per-pound second-place daily prize.

Following Saturday's weigh-in, most teams retired to more relaxing activities for the evening. Many attended the GLBC Pig Roast to take delight in some fine barbecue, exciting raffles and enjoyable camaraderie. Others enjoyed the offerings of the local communities while recharging their batteries for round two of the great carp shoot.

Sunday morning found the contestants back at it. The weather was a slight bit better than the day before, but not great by any means. Following the 3 o'clock weigh-in deadline, the numbers were tallied and scoreboards updated. The fishing archers had managed to surpass their first day total by hauling in another 14,009 pounds, bringing the total for the two-day event to 27,320 pounds. Not great by traditional GLBC standards, but still over 13-1/2 tons of "trash" fish removed from the bay.

Claiming the title of Great Lakes Bowfishing Champions for the second straight year was the team of Brant Gnagey and Thad McGathy of Bayport, MI. The pair managed to arrow and retrieve 2,059 pounds of fish. That's a lot of work for one weekend!

Taking second place with a very respectable 1,446 pounds were the team of Tom Ross of Gratiot, MI and Mike Williams of Avoca, MI. Third place honors went to Dan Rasmussen of Lakeview, MI and Roger Rasmussen of Stanton, MI with 1,177 pounds. Cash prizes were awarded to the top 20 teams.

Daily "Big Fish" honors for Sunday went to Chris Berkley of Milford, OH with a tournament-topper 21.44-pound carp, closely followed by McGathy with a 20.81-pound brute.

Prizes were also awarded for other rough fish species taken during the tournament. Darl Decator of Lowell, MI nabbed the Largest Goldfish cash prize by arrowing a 3.38-pound whopper and falling short of the all-time tournament record by only half a pound. Scott Heikkila of Marquette, MI claimed the Largest Gar Pike prize, tipping the scales with a nice 6.25-pounder. Teammate Mark Heikkila, also of Marquette took Largest Dogfish honors with a 4.06-pound lunker. And last, but not least, Dave Donley of Edmore, MI was honored for arrowing the smallest carp of the tournament, which weighed in at a mere 0.97 pounds.

A pair of crossbows donated by George Gardner of Hunters Mfg. Co. were awarded to the "Average Joe" team – the pair that harvested closest to the average weight per team. The team of Dan Horn of Almont, MI and Frank Evanko of Warren, MI brought in 110 pounds, landing them closest to the tournament's average mark of 109.28 pounds per team.

Besides providing a lot of recreational fun for hundreds of sportsmen and ridding the bay of unwanted and destructive "trash" fish, this tournament had another worthwhile underlying cause. Organizers raised thousands of dollars for the Wildlife Education Foundation Youth Camp located near Caseville.

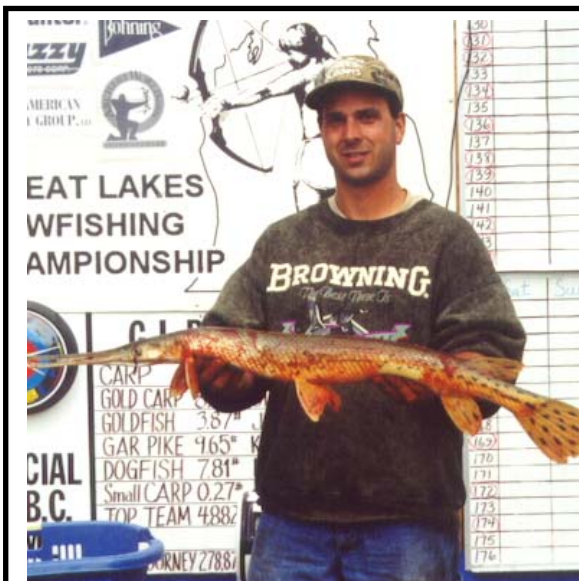
The facility, a State-owned Outdoor Center nestled in the scenic woods of Sleeper State Park, was slated to be shut down and demolished in the early 1980's due to a lack of funding. The foundation stepped in and volunteered to fund, operate, and improve the camp at that time. Now in its 18th year, the organization has hosted nearly 60,000 campers. The vast majority of campers are kids who come from all over Michigan to experience the great outdoors, learn about environmental respect and wildlife conservation, and experience shooting sports and firearms safety. Thanks to the success of this tournament and the generosity of its supporters, money is never a barrier to kids who want an outdoor experience.

"I would like to thank the dozens of generous sporting goods manufacturers and dealers from around the country who donated merchandise," said tournament Director Bob Easterbrook, Sr. "Between them, the Caseville and Bayport area businesses, the supportive tournament participants, and especially our sponsors, **Bohning**, **Bowhunter Magazine**, **Muzzy Products**, the **North American Archery Group**, and **ArcheryWorld.com**, the foundation and the kids who benefit from the camp are extremely grateful. It's great to see so many people come together, have this much fun, and provide much-needed funds for such a worthwhile program."

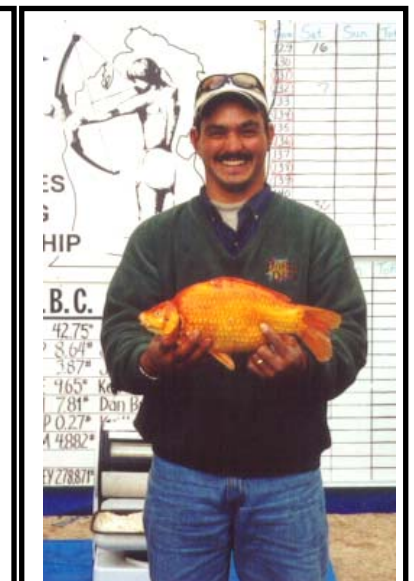

Largest Gold Fish: 3.38 lbs.

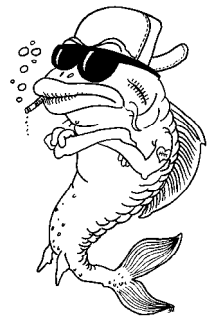
